You do not need a Z-Pass for journeys that start or end in this area.

110* Fare zones 110 (Zurich City) and 120 (Winterthur City) count double in price calculations.

For journeys to neighbouring fare networks

For travel to neighbouring fare networks, the following guidelines apply:

- Please purchase or validate your ticket prior to boarding.
- Travel between the point of departure and destination is always comprised of multiple zones.
- When you purchase a Z-Pass ticket, the appropriate zones will be automatically calculated.
- Zones that are not directly linked by public transportation cannot be directly combined.
- The zones and period of validity can be found on the tickets.
- Tickets valid according to calendar day (e.g. day passes, travelcards) may be used up to 5.00 a.m. on the following day.
- Within the zones covered by your ticket, you may make as many journeys as you wish on all available means of transport.
- The journey must be completed before the period of validity has expired.

Ticket options

For journeys that start and end in the same Z-Pass corridor, it is necessary to purchase a Z-Pass ticket. You may choose from the following ticket options:

- Single ticket (valid for 1–3 hours; depending on the number of purchased zones)
- Day pass (valid for 1 calendar day, not 24 hours)
- Multiple-journey ticket (6 single tickets to be validated as needed)
- Multiple day passes (6 day passes to be validated as needed)
- Monthly and annual travelcards (valid from a date of your choice, personal)

Additional fare conditions

Children

Children aged 6 to 16 travel at reduced rates. Children under 6 years of age travel for free when accompanied by an adult.

Young people

Young people can travel with a group ticket at a reduced price up to the day prior to their

25th birthday. In addition, personal annual and monthly travelcards in 2nd class are available at a special “Junior” price.

Onward journeys within a participating fare network

Do you have a Z-Pass and wish to travel onward within a participating fare network? Then you need a regular ticket for this fare network starting from the zone directly adjacent to the area covered by your Z-Pass. Exception: This does not apply when the means of transport for your onward journey in the neighbouring fare network does not stop within the area of validity covered by your Z-Pass (e.g. on an express train without intermediate stops). In this case, you will need a ticket from the last stop.

Journeys beyond network boundaries

For travel beyond the network boundary, Z-Pass tickets are only valid up to the last timetable-scheduled stop within the applicable zones.

Example: You are holding an “A-Welle–ZVV” Z-Pass ticket valid for all zones. For the onward

journey to Bern on the InterCity from Zurich main station to Bern with no intermediate stops, you will need a connecting ticket for Zurich HB–Bern.

The availability of connecting tickets depends on the place of purchase.

Nighttime network

When using the nighttime network, a night supplement is required for all Z-Pass tickets.

ZSG Surcharge

When travelling with Lake Zurich Navigation Company (ZSG) boats on Lake Zurich and the Obersee as well as on the Limmat, a separate surcharge is required in addition to a valid ticket; see www.zvv.ch or www.zsg.ch for details.
